The community welcomes our new Administrator, Shirley Phillips.

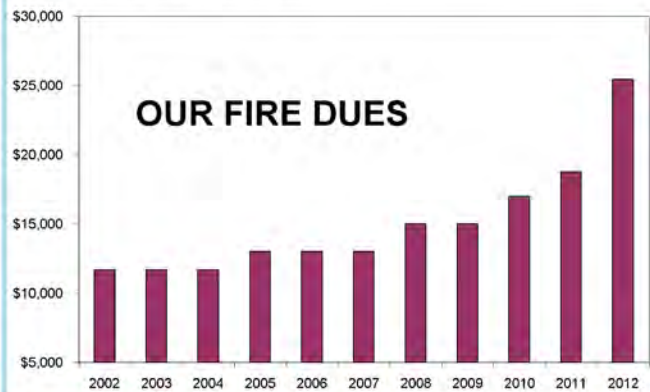
We also thank our outgoing Administrator, Mary Williams, for 19 years of dedicated service.
