Tyne Valley Fire District Joint Emergency Measures Organization

After 3 years of planning, Lot 11 and Area joined with the communities of Ellerslie-Bideford, Lady Slipper and Tyne Valley, and the Tyne Valley Fire Department, to form the Tyne Valley Fire District Joint Emergency Measures Organization.

Knowing that any emergency or disaster could impact our entire region, councillors and volunteers from the four municipalities developed protocol on how our communities will work together.

While each community is still responsible for their own emergency preparedness, the Joint EMO will ensure the best use is made of all available volunteers and resources in the case of any large emergency.

THE LOT 11 AND AREA WATERSHED GROUP

Making A Difference

The Lot 11 and Area Watershed Group manages 15,602 hectares, which includes 10 primary and 18 smaller streams.

In 2016 we:

- Provided meaningful employment to 9 people
- Did 3 separate beach cleanups
- Held 14 Watershed Camps for 30 community children
- Redeveloped 2.5 km of the Foxley River Demonstration Woodlot Trail System
- Worked on access trails and blockage removal on Brooks River, Grants Brook, and

MacDonald's River

 Planted 240 Native Trees/Shrubs on the Foxley River to catch sediment runoff

In 2017 we plan to:

- Rehabilitate 3 km of the Enmore River
- Plant 1,250 Native Trees/Shrubs along the Enmore River and Freeland Creek
- Improve connectivity and riparian zone diversity on the Freeland Creek
- 4th year of monitoring Enmore River for federal government CAMP initiative
- Beach cleanups, stream maintenance and more!

Formed in 2008, the Lot 11 and Area Watershed Group evaluates, preserves and enhances our watersheds so they may continue to provide for the needs of our community and our environment.
